Dogs- Rabies, DHPP, Leptospirosis, Bordetella, Influenza vaccines and negative intestinal parasite exam.
Cats- Rabies, FRCP vaccines and negative intestinal parasite exam.

_____ I authorize the performance of the following procedures:

_____ Routine Adult Dental Scaling/ Polishing/ Fluoride Treatment

_____ Juvenile Dental Prophylaxis-Includes a tooth brushing, polishing, fluoride treatment and Oravet application, for pets 6 months of age and younger. Cost is \$62.70 if performed at the same time as another anesthetic procedure.

_____ Oravet Application-A product that acts like a wax and produces a negative charge on teeth to repel plaque, keeping teeth and gums cleaner and healthier for a longer period of time. Cost is \$36.93 with a Routine Adult Dental Scaling/ Polishing/ Fluoride Treatment.

_____ Oravet Take Home Kit- There are 8 applications of the above product. Cost \$38.32

_____ Tooth/ Teeth Extraction if Needed

_____ Dental X-Rays- Full Mouth- Dental x-rays, just as for humans, allow your veterinarian to diagnose and monitor disease of your pet's mouth, as well as to formulate an individual treatment plan for your pet. A full mouth set is \$127.07.

_____ Individual Dental X-Ray if Needed _____

_____ Doxirobe Application-Used for pets with periodontal disease, it actually causes gum tissue to reattach to the tooth, helping to prevent tooth loss. Cost is \$108.89.

Factors that limit our ability to detect every dental problem your pet may have with just an oral exam may include:

1. Lack of patient cooperation can impair visualization, especially of back teeth.
2. Many periodontal problems can be detected only by probing under the gum with an instrument.
3. Dental tartar can hide underlying cavities or fractures.

If further problems are detected while your pet is under anesthesia, how should they be handled?

Do only what I have authorized. I understand that any additional dental work needed will require another anesthetic episode to complete the dental treatment.

Should an emergency arise calling for procedures in addition to or different from those now contemplated, I further request and authorize whatever emergency treatment is needed. I consent to the administration and use of anesthesia. I agree to pay in full for all services rendered including those deemed necessary for medical or surgical complications or otherwise unforeseen circumstances.

The nature and purpose of the procedures, possible alternative methods of treatment, risks involved, and possibility of complications have been fully explained to me. I acknowledge that no guarantee or assurance has been made as to the results that may be obtained.

I have been offered a Pre-Operative Blood Screen at the cost of \$129. This will inform the doctor of the condition of my pet's liver and kidneys, as well as the general health of my pet.

I have been offered a Pre-Operative Electrocardiogram (EKG) for my pet at a cost of \$54.87. This will help the doctor to detect electrical arrhythmias of the heart that may cause problems with anesthesia.

Both the extraction of a tooth and periodontal (gum) disease can be painful. I have been offered additional pain medication (other than general anesthesia) to help make my pet more comfortable when (s)he recovers from anesthesia. Pain medication will only be given if needed, and it is required with all tooth extraction procedures. The cost ranges from \$20-\$45 for this medication.
